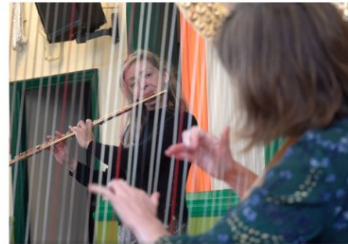

Description of Project:

Lewisham Irish Community centre is looking for a youth worker to join our youth team. We provide a free weekly drop-in to all local children between the age of eight and fourteen each Wednesday from 4-7 pm. Up to twenty-five young people from various neighbouring primary schools attend onsite.

The aim of the project is to provide a safe, stimulating environment for children to play and experience activities which will develop their social and creative skills, enhancing their sense of health and wellbeing throughout childhood and beyond.

Current activities include access to board games, books, games consoles, air hockey, darts, music, arts and craft sessions, sports and many more fun activities.

Specific role and responsibilities

- To assist with the planning and delivering of a 39-week program of activities which including cookery, arts and crafts and sports projects
- Organizing and supervising physical activities i.e. group games.
- Supervising child led recreational activities inc. Xbox & board games.
- Setting up and clearing away equipment
- Undertaking administrative tasks, maintaining effective recording systems and responding to activities
- Attending regular training and developing opportunities to maintain up to date. knowledge on safeguarding and health & safety
